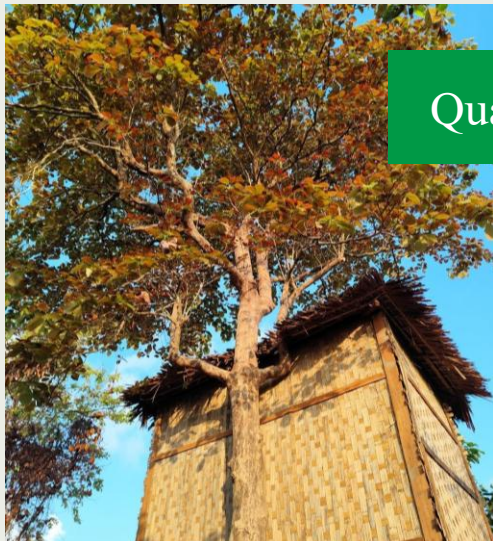


Dear friends, partners and supporters,

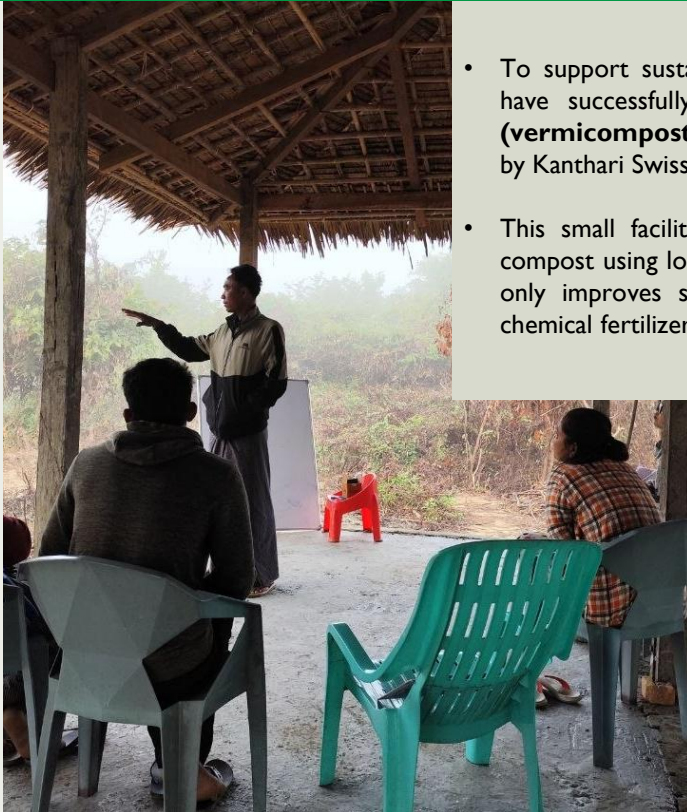

“Small Scale Earthworm Farming Established



- To support sustainable and low-cost agricultural practices, we have successfully constructed a new **earthworm farming (vermicomposting) unit** for small-scale production, supported by Kanthari Swiss Foundation
- This small facility enables us to produce high-quality organic compost using locally available materials. Earthworm farming not only improves soil fertility but also reduces dependence on chemical fertilizers and promotes eco-friendly farming.



“Liquid Fertilizer Production for Farm Use”



The TLA team has been actively producing **organic liquid fertilizer (Fish Amino Acid)** for use in growing seasonal crops and plants around the school compound. This initiative focuses on creating affordable, nutrient-rich solutions that enhance crops qualities and growths while improving soil health.

By utilizing natural ingredients and local resources, the team is demonstrating alternative ways instead of applying chemical inputs in farming, finding alternative ways to help farmers adopt safer and more sustainable agricultural practices.

- We are excited to officially launch our **9-month Youth Intensive Training on Sustainable Agriculture and Community Action** in March and finish in November 2026.
